Born in New Zealand, educated at the French Lycée, London and Newnham College, Cambridge. Graduated in French and Russian, 1964. Lived in Belgrade for a year. Awarded an MPhil degree, with a dissertation on modern Serbian poetry. Taught Serbian and Croatian language and literature at School of Slavonic and East European Studies, now part of University College, University of London, 1971-2002. She now works as a free-lance translator and writer. Her published works include a monograph on the work of Ivo Andrić, *Bridge between East and West* (1984), *Voices in the Shadows: Women and Verbal Art in Serbia and Bosnia* (2000) and *A History of Central European Women's Writing* (2001). She began translating in the late 1960s and has had many translations of Serbian, Croatian and Bosnian fiction published, including several works by Ivo Andrić and Dubravka Ugrešić.
